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


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Celebrating Years of Knorr-Bremse Global Care

In December 2004, as my father and I witnessed the harrowing images of destruction caused by the tsunami in Southeast Asia, which claimed hundreds of thousands of lives, we knew we had to act. Just three weeks later, on January 18, 2005, we founded the non-profit organization Knorr-Bremse Global Care together with employees from the Knorr-Bremse site in Munich. Our goal was clear from the outset: to provide fast, efficient, and direct assistance.

Today, two decades later, I look back with deep gratitude and pride at what we have achieved. What began as an immediate response to a devastating disaster has evolved into a professional commitment that creates sustainable impact in communities around the world. Aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, we focus on projects that primarily offer long-term prospects and solutions.

Through our regionally anchored Global Care entities, we ensure that our work is deeply rooted in local communities, fostering a direct connection to the people who benefit from our

projects. Our efforts empower individuals to lead self-determined and economically independent lives – and we are delighted to have reached more than 1 Million beneficiaries.

But none of this would have been possible without the support of many. My heartfelt thanks go to Knorr-Bremse as a company, which has always stood by us. To our partner organizations, whose expertise and dedication drive our projects forward, and to the passionate employees of Knorr-Bremse, whose enthusiasm brings our work to life.

The global challenges of our time, from the climate crisis to social inequality and loss of biodiversity, can only be overcome if we collectively take responsibility and work together to develop innovative, systemic solutions.

Education WaSH




One of Knorr-Bremse Global Care's core focus areas is education, where we strive to improve access to and completion of tertiary education, including vocational training, for young people aged 15 to 24.

Our Rational

Education is a human right and key to sustainable development: A well-educated population is the basis for fighting poverty and inequality, for sustainable economic growth and for social progress. Education has a positive impact on health, strengthens the role of women and enables peaceful and democratic participation in society and the economy.

Youth Unemployment Rate Age 15 to 241





Knorr-Bremse Global Care's second thematic focus is dedicated to WaSH. Our efforts aim to reduce water-related diseases through a holistic approach that engages the local population and fosters behavioral change, complemented by the provision of WaSH infrastructure.

Our Rational

Clean and safe drinking water, hygiene training and proper wastewater disposal protect communities from diseases, increase life expectancy and thus create the basis for people to have prospects for life, education, and development.

Unlocking Potential and Empowering Youth



Through Vocational Training with Senai

In Brazil, youth unemployment remains high at 17.9% (2023), reflecting the lasting impact of past recessions and the COVID-19 pandemic. While the rate has steadily declined since 2014, Knorr-Bremse Global Care is dedicated to further reducing it by ensuring young people have access to secure, decent jobs. Since 2015, in partnership with Knorr-Bremse Global Care Brazil and SENAI (National Service for Industrial

Training), we have been bridging this gap through vocational training that enhances technical skills and prepares students for apprenticeships at the Knorr-Bremse location in Brazil. The program has been highly effective, with 70% of participants securing apprenticeships and permanent jobs.

Target group	Each year approx. 30 students from socially vulnerable areas in neighbouring cities
Intervention	Vocational training for technical skills, e.g., Mechanics, Maintenance Technology
Impact	A formal degree that opens the door to an apprenticeship at Knorr-Bremse (70 % hiring rate)

Overcoming Barriers of Poverty and Systemic Inequalities



With Boys Hope Girls Hope and Village Collective

Inequalities faced by minorities in the United States are well-documented, particularly in areas such as wealth, education, employment, housing, and more.

In collaboration with Knorr-Bremse Global Care North America, Boys Hope Girls Hope of Northeastern Ohio and Village Collective offer training courses and skill-building workshops focused on academic aspects, self-care, employment, and financial management.

Additionally, a selected number of scholars are provided with housing opportunities. The goal of this partnership is to create career pathways for young people pursuing post-secondary education and to help them realize their full potential.

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

Clean Water, Brighter Futures



Tackling Water Scarcity with World Vision

Contaminated water spreads water-borne diseases, forcing children to miss school and parents to leave their farms to care for sick family members. Girls face additional challenges, especially during menstruation, due to a lack of clean water. Since 2013, cooperation between Knorr-Bremse Global Care and World Vision in different locations in Ghana (currently Krachi Nchumuru) has tackled these challenges by improving access to clean water. The joint

initiative builds on past successes, ensuring communities can sustain water systems, enhancing WaSH services in healthcare facilities and schools, and educating students and staff on disease prevention.

Through our cooperation with World Vision, we reached our one millionth beneficiary in 2023, with 200,000 of those beneficiaries coming from our projects with World Vision.


How Say Earth Brought Life Back to Baghola's Pond

India continues to face significant challenges from garbage, waste, and pollution. In Baghola, the dumping of waste in recent years severely impacted the local pond's condition.

In 2023, together with our partner, Say Earth, Knorr-Bremse Global Care India initiated a project to rejuvenate the pond using a wastewater filtration system to restore it to its former state. Since then, water quality has improved significantly, and biodiversity has noticeably increased, with frequent sightings of birds and pond frogs. Furthermore, regular community interaction and pond committee meetings led by *Committee President*, *Mr. Ghanshyam Vasisht (right)*, have strengthened local engagement ensuring continued progress with restoration efforts.

By offering holistic support from early childhood development to career readiness, Safe-Hubs empower young people at every stage of their journey. They also drive local economic growth by creating jobs, fostering entrepreneurship, and supporting small businesses, building selfsustaining ecosystems that benefit both young people and their communities. Building on its success in South Africa, AMANDLA

and Knorr-Bremse Global Care took the next step in 2021 by launching Safe-Hub Global, a joint social enterprise dedicated to scaling this impact worldwide. Since then, new Safe-Hub initiatives have been established in Berlin, Philadelphia, and Delhi, with more to come. The driving force behind this work is a bold vision: a world where all young people have equitable opportunities regardless of their background.

Driving Change – Our Impact

With over € 35 million invested in projects worldwide, Knorr-Bremse Global Care has reached more than one million people – removing barriers, unlocking potential, and empowering brighter futures.



Through Knorr-Bremse Global Care's provision of financial resources and on-the-ground expertise:

In South Africa

47%

of the crime rate around the Safe-Hub in Khayelitsha, operated by our partner Amandla, has been successfully reduced.

In Brazil

70%

of the graduates of the Tech+ program of our partner SENAI were contracted by Knorr-Bremse after the course.

In Ghana

78%

reduction in cases of waterborne diseases was observed in the World Vision project area of B-Zongo, Nkwanta, in less than eight months.

In China

36

disabled young people from 4 project schools in Chengdu, run by our partner Save the Children in China, secured jobs or became self-employed after graduation.

In the USA

88%

higher freshman persistence rates were achieved in the Boys Hope Girls Hope college transition project compared to the national average for class retention.
